#### CLUB SUPPORT FOR 'WALKING OFF THE WAR WITHIN'

On Saturday 7 October 2023 the Ballarat and District Early Holden Car Club supported the 'Walking Off the War Within' charity event at Lake Wendouree.

It was thought that the support would be in the taking people for a couple of laps of the lake as the club members do with the Legacy Kids each January. However, with the number of people attending, as well as those participating in the walk, that would prove somewhat difficult, so it was a matter of parking the cars in the northern car park of Windmill Drive, just south of the star/finish line, where all the walkers would pass them. There were eight club members in attendance with six Holdens and two Fords. Later they were joined by Brendan, a member of the Vintage & Classic Car Club Ballarat, with his 1955 MG Magnette Sedan.

Nathan's father, John, took on the role of running the 'Walking Off the War Within' and making it an Australia-wide event. He has worked hard to spread the word about what drove Nathan to take his own life and try to ensure that no other family has to have this happen to them.

### **Club Run Etiquette**

There is nothing better than sharing our love of cars with a group of likeminded enthusiasts out on the road, and we encourage all members to join us on our club runs. You can come along in any car, it doesn't need to be old, and it doesn't even need to be a Holden. It's about getting out as a group and enjoying each other's company, not about what we're driving.

However, there are a few simple protocols to ensure everyone has a good day...

- Always RSVP to the Run Coordinator and let them know if you change your mind. It's helpful to know how many are expected and saves the group waiting around for a no-show who's changed their mind.
- Listen to the pre-run briefing to get a basic understanding of the route and more importantly the destination. Blindly following the car in front is great while they're there.
- If the weather forecast issued the night before a run is over 35 deg C, then the run will most likely be cancelled. Keep an eye on the App for any updates.
- Get to the departure point on time or phone ahead if you're going to be late.
- Out on the road, work off the car behind, not the car in front. In other words, keep the car behind in your mirrors and adjust your speed accordingly. Don't try to catch up to the car ahead. This helps ensure the group stays together.
- Make sure the car behind has seen you when turning a corner wait at the turn until the car indicates before continuing, then they will wait for the next car etc. Don't be concerned about losing contact with the car in front, as they should be looking out for you.
- Leave a reasonable gap between you and the car in front so that other motorists can overtake if they wish.
- If you're joining us on route, make sure the Run Coordinator knows of your pickup point to ensure we take that route. Also be ready to roll as the convoy approaches.
- We don't leave anyone stranded on the road if you lose sight of the car behind, pull over and wait. If they don't appear, turn around to render assistance.
- Always follow the car in front. If you think they've taken a wrong turn then let's all take the wrong turn. It's better the club gets lost together than splits up in all directions it also saves the person behind you having to make a split decision as to who they trust the most!
- Remember it's a club run, not a club race. If there's a tired old grey in front, so be it enjoy it for what it is. Who cares if you're late in your 308.
- Generally, the return trip from the destination is up to you but let the 'Run Coordinator' know when you're heading off.

Following these simple pointers will help ensure everybody has a good day - together!
